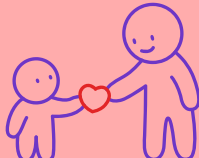




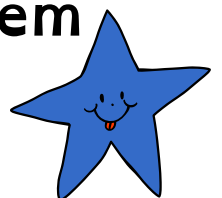
EARLY LEVEL HOME LEARNING GRID
